Proposed Rule

- Safe Ports Act requires additional data
- Proposed rule published January, 2008
- Over 300 Industry comments
- Customs to consider the comments
- Industry groups ask for a “Pilot Program”

Security Data (10) Importers Responsibility

- Shipper Name and Address
- Seller Name and Address
- Buyer Name and Address
- Ship to Name and Address
- Importer of Record
- Container Stuffing Location
- Consolidator Name and Address
- Consignee
- Country of Origin
- Commodity / Harmonized Tariff Number

Carrier Data (2)

- Stow Plan
- Container Status Message

When To File

24 hours prior to
loading of the
vessel at origin

How To File

- **ABI**
 - Automated Broker Interface.
- **AMS**
 - Automated Manifest System.

Final Rule

The Office of Management & Budget
approved the rule on Nov. 6, 2008.

Congress has a 15 day review period

Anticipated publication in Federal
Register by Thanksgiving

Expect 12 months phase in period

What Importers Can Do Now

- Advise suppliers on what information is needed and when
- Purchase orders and contracts need to include the data needs and timing
- Check that your Customs broker can receive and transmit this data
- Review with your ocean carriers
